Modern slavery is a crime and a violation of fundamental human rights. It takes various forms, such as slavery, servitude, forced and compulsory labour and human trafficking, all of which have in common the deprivation of a person's liberty by another in order to exploit them for personal or commercial gain.

We are committed to improving our practices to combat slavery and human trafficking.

Our Staff

At induction, all Fincher Utilities Ltd personnel are informed of the Company policy regarding Modern slavery and human trafficking. Each person provides identification and proof of address, previous employment and qualifications which are recorded on file.

Any non-British born personnel are subject to further checks which may involve visa's issued.

All staff are assigned a line manager who is responsible for the welfare of their charges, in addition a chain of command is established and further Company policies that guide and direct personnel through their employment.

Our Subcontractors & Supply chain.

We are committed to ensuring that there is no modern slavery or human trafficking in our supply chains or in any part of our business.

In light of the obligation to report on measures to ensure that all parts of our business and supply chain are slavery free we have reviewed our workplace policies and procedures to assess their effectiveness in identifying and tackling modern slavery issues.

Our workplace policies and procedures demonstrate our commitment to acting ethically and with integrity in all our business relationships and to implementing and enforcing effective systems and controls to ensure slavery and human trafficking is not taking place anywhere in our supply chains. New supplier are informed of the Company Policy and required to sign their agreement and understanding.

All personnel who work on Fincher Utilities Ltd sites are named and qualifications logged on file to ensure everyone is trained and informed up to the required standard.

Due diligence processes for slavery and human trafficking

We have in place systems to:

- Identify and assess potential risk areas in our subcontract chains.
- Mitigate the risk of slavery and human trafficking occurring in our supply chains.
- Protect whistle blowers.
